

Delhi not affected by economic slowdown: Kejriwal

New Delhi, Sep 16 (IANS) Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Monday claimed that the national capital was not affected by the economic slowdown in the country, however, he also implored the Centre to take necessary steps to improve the situation.

"In this period of economic slowdown, the people of Delhi are not feeling the pinch as much, because of Delhi government's schemes. We

all want the economic situation of Delhi and the country to improve," said Kejriwal at an event organised by the Chamber of Trade and Industries.

Kejriwal, in the event, awarded 36 successful traders and businessmen from Delhi.

Addressing traders, the Chief Minister said, "Trade is slowing down. There has been no increase in the salaries but people's expenses are rising. However, the Delhi



government has provided a lot of support to the people of Delhi, so that they do not feel the pinch of the slowdown as much. For instance, we waived off the

electricity bills up to 200 units. We provided free water and waived off the old water bills. Now, travelling in a bus will also be free for women."

Commenting on the state of the economy, Kejriwal said there is a recession.

"I came across many traders today, who told me that around 30 to 40 per cent of the turnover has reduced. I hope the economy will improve soon so that the trade also improves. We appeal to the

Central Government to take all necessary steps to improve the economy."

Kejriwal said he is from traders family and so I can understand the agony, pain and problems of a trader very well.

"We have always taken care of the interests of the traders. We now have GST coming into force, but in the first two years, the Delhi government had automatically reduced VAT on all items from 12.5 per cent to 5 per cent."

SC says Collegium has taken decision on Justice Kureshi



New Delhi, Sep 16 (IANS) The Supreme Court on Monday said that the Collegium has taken a decision on the issue related to elevation of Justice Akil Kureshi as Chief Justice of the Madhya Pradesh High Court.A bench headed by Chief Justice of India (CJI) Ranjan Gogoi said that the decision of the Collegium will be uploaded on the apex court's website soon.

The court was hearing Gujarat High Court Advocates Association's petition challenging the delay in the elevation of Justice Kureshi.

The apex court had on August 28 said it had received a communication from the Ministry of Law and Justice on the

Collegium's recommendation to elevate Justice Kureshi.

Senior advocate F.S. Nariman, appearing for the association, had said the Union government should act as "distinguished communicator" on the recommendation made by the Collegium. On May 10, the Supreme Court

Collegium headed by Chief Justice Gogoi had recommended Justice Kureshi, currently the senior most judge in the Gujarat High Court, as the most suitable candidate to be appointed as the Chief Justice of the Madhya Pradesh High Court.

Disregarding the recommendation, the Centre notified the appointment of Justice Ravi Shanker Jha as the acting Chief Justice of the Madhya Pradesh High Court last month after Justice Sanjay Kumar Seth retired on June 9.

The association has requested the court to direct the Centre to implement the Collegium's resolution of May 10.

India, Thailand begin joint military exercise in Meghalaya



Umroi (Meghalaya), Sep 16 (IANS) The Indian Army and Royal Thai Army began their latest joint exercise here on Monday, an Army official said.

A total of 100 troops from the Indian Army led by Colonel Rahul Joshi and 45 troops of Royal Thai Army led by Colonel Thiradej Limkunagul are taking part in the 14-day Exercise MAITREE which is slated to last till September 29.

The exercise will showcase the planning and execution of joint skills of soldiers while conducting Counter Terrorism Operations in the state-of-the-art Joint Training Node at Umroi Cantonment, about 25 km from Shillong.

"The exercise will be conducted under the overarching framework of United Nations Mandate 2006. Both contingents

will share their valuable experiences in the conduct of counter-terrorism operations in form of lectures, drills, demonstrations and skill-at-arm with an aim to refine tactics, techniques and procedures," said defence spokesperson, Wing Commander Ratnakar Singh.

He said that Exercise MAITREE is an annual joint military exercise which is being conducted alternatively in Thailand and India since 2006. This is the first time that it is being held in Meghalaya.

"The training will strengthen both the countries in terms of security challenges that we are facing right now... Both the Royal Thai Army and Indian Army have a long history... since 2006 we have been conducting joint exercises. We are hoping that we will continue this relationship with the Indian Army," said Royal Thailand Army's Col. Thiradej Limkunagul.

Col. Joshi said: "It is an opportunity for the Indian Army to host the Royal Thai Army in this joint military training exercise. Both the countries have a long association and such training enhances our own capabilities and understanding. I am sure both the teams will take lots of many things from this joint military training."

Congress demands Gangwar's apology for 'North Indian' comments



New Delhi, Sep 16 (IANS) The Congress party on Monday slammed Union Labour Minister Santosh Gangwar for his comments on North Indian youth, saying that the Minister should either apologise for his remarks or admit that the Central government believes that North Indian youth are essentially incapable.

Congress spokesperson Rajiv Shukla also pointed out that the country's unemployment rate has touched an all-time high at 8.2 per cent.

Blaming North Indian youth for failing to secure jobs at an event in Bareilly on Sunday, Gangwar said that there was no shortage of jobs but the companies wishing to recruit say that these youths are ineligible.

Shukla said here that one crore jobs were lost in 2018, while youth unemployment is growing each year at 2.5 per cent.

He also said that both the agriculture and manufacturing sectors are lagging behind, while export is showing negative growth.

According to the Congress spokesperson, while the government should take measures to handle the situation, its only response to the crisis has been with speeches and issuing advertisements.

He noted that despite former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh saying that the government should accept that the economy is in the grip of a slowdown, the Union government is not accepting the fact.

Maharashtra to deploy drones for emergency medical supplies



Mumbai, Sep 16 (IANS) In a first, the Maharashtra government has joined hands with private drone operator Zipline to deliver blood products and emergency medicines to people in remote areas in collaboration with Serum Institute of India (SII), an official said on Monday.

Scheduled for an early 2020 launch, the Maharashtra Medical Drone Delivery Service (MMDDS) will be available 24x7, on-demand, and would include emergency deliveries of blood products, vaccines and life-saving medication.

For this, Zipline will set up 10 distribution centres - starting with Pune and Nandurbar - for launching MMDDS in phases across the state and the ultimate goal is to cover all the 12 crore people by reaching them life-saving medicines within minutes.

The first two distribution centres will be financed through a grant by the SII, and the other centres will be set up by the government and other private or philanthropic partners.

The drones will take off and land at Zipline's distribution centres without requiring any additional infrastructure or manpower at the clinics they would serve.

Each drone can fly autonomously carrying upto 1.8 kgs cargo at 110 km per hour with a round-trip range of 160 km (80 km both ways) braving even adverse weather conditions, explained an official.

Each distribution centre would cater to a delivery area of over 20,000 sq km and effectively serve around 20 million people. The deliveries will be made from the sky, with the drone descending to a safe height and dropping a parachute with its medical cargo at a designated spot.

8,98,050 LPG refills delivered to homes in J&K: Govt

New Delhi, Sep 16 (IANS) The Centre on Monday told the Supreme Court it is taking proper care of supply of essential commodities to the people in Jammu and Kashmir, saying 8,98,050 LPG refills have been delivered to home and 6.46 lakh quintals of ration distributed in the last one month.

Apprising the bench headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi, the government said all possible steps to reduce inconvenience to the public are being taken.

The court was told that the government has already kept safe three months' stock of essential commodities like food grains, liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) cylinders, petrol, and diesel.

Also, the government has introduced Special Market Intervention Price Scheme to purchase apples this season from the apple growers.

The scheme will focus mainly in purchasing the fruits from apple growing districts in Jammu and Kashmir and fruit market situated in Sopore (Baramulla), Parimpora (Srinagar), Shopian and Batingo (Anantnag) so as to ensure that the farmers are not exploited and get remunerative prices.

Blind boy sodomised by senior at Dehradun school

Dehradun, Sep 16 (IANS) In a shocking incident, an 11-year-old boy was sodomised by a 16-year-old boy inside the premises of a premier institute for the visually impaired here in Uttarakhand.

The matter came to light only when the victim complained to the principal of the institute on Rajpur Road. The accused has since been arrested and handed over to the police. He has been kept under house arrest at the same institute.

Ashok Kumar, Additional Director General of Police, Uttarakhand, confirmed the incident to IANS and said that the alleged act of sodomy took place on September 2. When the victim complained to the principal of the institute, internal probe was initiated. The principal Deepika Mathur approached the Rajpur Marg Police Station only on September 6. Since the incident happened at the premier institute for the visually impaired established by the government of India, we took time to investigate the matter.

Pak is deep in communal milieu: B'desh minister

Agartala, Sep 16 (IANS) Pakistan is sunk in the poison of communal milieu, Bangladesh is totally free from that danger and that's why the country (Bangladesh) is now a role model for many developing nations, Bangladesh Information Minister Hasan Mahmud said here.

"Bangladesh is now heading in many indices because the country is entirely free from communal hatred and environment. Pakistan is deeply sunk in the poison of communal settings, that's why it lagging behind," Mahmud said here on Sunday night after inaugurating the first three-day film festival. The Bangladesh Minister said that there was a rigorous effort to break the secular ethos of the country specially after the assassination of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in August 1975 and that destructive faction was partly successful, but we could restore the secular guiding principle under the able leadership of present Prime



Minister Sheikh Hasina."Four years after the country attained independence from Pakistan, "Bangabandhu" (Sheikh Mujibur Rahman) was eliminated to destroy the humanity and a secular nation. People belonging to different religions like Muslims, Hindus, Christians and Buddhists had contributed to the liberation war," the minister said.

"Returning to Dhaka, I would ask the concerned policy making bodies and inform the Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to further develop the roads and border infrastructure along India-Bangladesh frontiers", Mahmud said.

In the three-day film festival, 20 films made with India-Bangladesh joint initiatives and movies on Bangladesh liberation war

would be screened.

The minister, who was accompanied by many intellectuals, parliamentarians, senior officials, artists, said that around 15 lakh Bangladeshi refugees, a number larger than the state's then population, had taken shelter in Tripura during the nine month long liberation war in 1971. Tripura Tourism and Transport Minister Pranajit Singh Roy said that if the Bangladesh government did not help India, the turbines and heavy machineries for the 726 MW gas based power project in southern Tripura could not be transported to the northeastern state from other parts of India via Bangladesh.

"India-Bangladesh connectivity with the northeastern states would soon be further developing after the completion of the 12.23 km Agartala-Akaura railway project being built at the cost of Rs 972 crore and construction of a big bridge in southern Tripura over river Feni.

HC strikes down Yogi's move to shift 17 OBCs to SC list

Lucknow, Sep 16 (IANS) In a major setback to the Yogi Adityanath government, the Allahabad High Court on Monday stayed its decision to include 17 Other Backward Castes (OBC) in the Scheduled Castes (SC) list.

The court's decision came on a petition filed by social activist Gorakh Prasad.

On June 24, the state government had directed District Magistrates and Commissioners to issue Scheduled Caste certificates to 17 OBCs - Kashyap, Rajbhar, Dhivar, Bind, Kumhar, Kahar, Kewat, Nishad, Bhar, Mallah, Prajapati, Dhimar, Batham, Turha, Godia, Manjhi and Machua.

The government's move was apparently aimed at wooing these communities ahead of by-elections to 12 Assembly seats.

The decision, incidentally, had been criticized even by the BJP-led Central government, with Social Justice and Empowerment Minister Thawar Chand Gehlot telling the Rajya Sabha on July 2 that the move was not in accordance with the Constitution.

Gehlot had said that if the UP government wanted to go ahead with



its proposal, it should follow procedure and send a proposal to the Centre. BSP chief Mayawati had also slammed the move as "unconstitutional" and called it "politically motivated".

"No government can include or remove any caste from the Scheduled Caste list. Article 341 prevents a government from doing so. Only the President and Parliament have the powers to do so," she had said.

Part 1 of Article 341 clearly states that the President can specify any group to the SC list through a public notification on the Governor's advice. Part 2 says that if a notification is released under part 1 of Article 341, it

can only be changed by Parliament. Part 2 also states that Parliament can specify, include or exclude any group from the SC list.

She pointed out that the notification cannot be undone by any other notification.

"These castes will no longer get the benefits of quota under the OBC category. They will be treated as general castes. It is clear that Yogi government has issued this order to deceive these castes," Mayawati had said. The BJP government in Uttar Pradesh is not the first to move the 17 OBCs to the SC list.

In 2005, the then Mulayam Singh Yadav government passed the first order to include 11 of these castes in the SC list but the order was stayed and the proposal sent to the Centre.

Subsequently, the BSP government of Mayawati quashed the notification.

The BSP later said these castes could be included in the SC list provided the SC quota is increased.

The SP government of Akhilesh Yadav again cleared the inclusion proposal ahead of the 2017 assembly elections but it was challenged and is still in court.

Punjab CM asks Harsimrat to stop lying about Nanak event

Chandigarh, Sep 16 (IANS) Punjab Chief Minister Amarinder Singh here on Monday asked Akali leader Harsimrat Badal to desist from exploiting the 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev for petty political gains by spreading falsehoods. Dubbing her attempts to malign his government, the Chief Minister said the Union Minister was trying to reduce the sacred occasion into a disgraceful saga of fibs and fabrications. Instead of asking the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC), which was a tool in the hands of her party to extend support to the state-level events, Harsimrat was trying to drive a wedge between the government and the religious body, he said. Criticising her over divisive and provocative statements, Singh said her recent comments had further exposed her party's cheap mindset and disruptive political agenda. For 10 years the SAD leaders tried to destroy every vestige of state's socio-economic fibre and were now trying to push the state back into its dark days with their insensitive and contentious statements, he said. Pointing out that the state had undertaken various development and infrastructural initiatives leading up to the momentous occasion, Singh said elaborate programmes had been finalised for the main function, to be held on November 12 at the holy city of Sultanpur Lodhi.
